Additionally, the laundromat on Front Street is freshly

renovated and opening under new management with a new name Bubbles and More.

In addition to the businesses scattered throughout the business district and residential neighborhoods, there has been quite a few new "faces" in the Harmon Plaza development. Flagship brands such as Cava and Shake Shack opened in Secaucus and a few more, including Dallas BBQ and Dulce de Haute are slated to open soon. Even the previously shuttered Holiday Inn has been renovated and is scheduled to open in the next couple of months under a different name. It is good to see businesses doing well in our Town and I hope residents come out and support them because a thriving local business community is good for all of us.

For all those who are thinking Spring, the wait is getting shorter!

Secaucus recently filed a lawsuit against Jersey City challenging their County Tax Ratio. We are pleased to report our efforts were successful and will result in a reduction of approximately \$1.5 million from the overall amount that the Town has to pay in taxes to the County for 2025. Secaucus Resident Wins the Harold Feinberg Conservation Award

At the NJ Meadowlands Eagle Festival held on January 12, 2025, Secaucus resident, Edna Duffy, received the 15th Annual Harold Feinberg Conservation Award. Mayor Gonnelli and Councilmembers Rob Constantino and Orietta Tringali joined Don Torino, President of the Bergen County Audubon Society (BCAS) to present the award. The award is in honor of Harold Feinberg, a longtime member and field trip chairman for BCAS.

Edna was nominated by Mayor Gonnelli for spearheading many eco-friendly initiatives in Town over the last 30 years. She volunteered at the Shade Tree committee and contributed to efforts leading to a growing tree canopy in Town.

Edna's firm belief of “save and build habitats and they shall come” resulted in her relentless pursuit of creating and nurturing spaces that are inviting for wildlife. She is a strong supporter of native gardens and helped create a butterfly garden at Fountain Park. Other gardens were created in local churchyards, at the Duck Pond, and Monarch Park on Radio Avenue, some with school children during Arbor Day Celebrations. Gardens at her own home are a collection of a wide variety of plants, creating an oasis for hummingbirds, butterflies, and bees. She is a passionate birder and travels widely, carefully cataloging birds sighted and writing about them, including a column Edna used to write for the Home News. She has also supported the Hackensack Riverkeeper, both financially and through clean-up efforts, for over two decades. From protecting nesting habitat to advocating for safe migration paths, Edna has partnered with a range of groups to help make our Town the nature-friendly place that it is.



New Leadership at Secaucus Fire Department

On January 3, 2025, in a room at La Reggia filled with supporters and fellow firefighters, the three new Fire Chiefs took the oath of Office. Lawrence Marciano was sworn in as Chief; Nicholas Nardone took over as Deputy Chief, and Jason Leppin stepped in as the Battalion Chief. The oath-taking ceremony was officiated by Town Clerk, Michael Marra.



Chief Lawrence J. Marciano began his service as a volunteer firefighter with the Secaucus Fire Department in September 1972 as a member of Washington Hook & Ladder Co. #1. Throughout his volunteer career, he has served as Captain of the company on several occasions and currently acts as its Treasurer. Chief Marciano is also a Life Member of the New Jersey State Firemen's Association and presently serves as the Trustee Chairman of the Secaucus Firemen's Relief Association.

Deputy Chief Nicholas B. Nardone Sr. began his service as a volunteer firefighter with the Secaucus Fire Department in January 1999. He is assigned to Engine Company #1 and has been a dedicated member of the department for over two decades. His commitment to firefighting runs in the family, as his son, Nicholas B. Nardone Jr., also serves as a firefighter.



Battalion Chief Jason Leppin began his service as a volunteer firefighter with Chicora Park Engine Co. #3 in August 1998. Over the years, he has remained a dedicated member of the department and currently serves as a Representative to the Secaucus Firemen's Relief Association.

In addition to the chiefs, Nicholas Mandara was sworn in as Lieutenant and Jasmine Garcia, Raymond Ortiz Jr., Kory Avila, Ismael Moronta-Rodriguez, Massim Iacopelli were sworn in as new volunteer firefighters at the Town Council Meeting on January 7, 2025.

We wish the new Chiefs the best of luck and thank them and all of our volunteer firefighters for their service to our community.

NJBPU Makes Major Milestone Announcement in Secaucus

The New Jersey Board of Public Utilities chose Secaucus to make an announcement of a major milestone—the State achieved 5 gigawatts (GW) of installed solar capacity, more than doubling its solar energy output since 2017. The announcement was made on January 23rd at the Secaucus Ice Rink where a solar installation project with a capacity of 287.1 kilowatts was completed by Schneider Electric. “We completed two major solar projects last year; one at the Ice Rink and the other at the Recreation Center. We thank NJBPU and Schneider Electric—without their partnership we would not have been able to complete these important projects. We will continue to explore more ways to expand our clean energy opportunities and look forward to expanding our solar energy projects,” said Mayor Michael Gonnelli.

Making the announcement about the State’s solar energy milestone, NJBPU President Christine Guhl-Sadovy congratulated Secaucus on its robust participation in the program and added, “Doubling the amount of solar capacity and crossing 5GW since Governor Murphy took office reflects the hard work and commitment of the NJBPU to bolstering our solar sector and the thousands of good, local jobs it employs while transitioning New Jersey to a clean energy future.”

Hudson County Commissioner Robert Baselice commended Governor Murphy’s commitment to positioning New Jersey as a national leader in clean energy and applauded Hudson County’s contribution towards this goal.

Amanda Nesheiwat, HCIA Director of Sustainability and Community Outreach and Bryan McGair, Sustainability Business Account Executive at Schneider electric also commended Secaucus’s participation in the solar initiative and pledged continued collaboration with the Town.



Secaucus Police Department Receives Distinguished Re-accreditation Honor

The Secaucus Police Department was reaccredited for a third time—a remarkable honor shared by only 8% of departments statewide.

Additionally, the department is the first in New Jersey to secure accreditation for its communication center, making it the first to hold accreditations for both the police department and communications center.



Harry Delgado, Accreditation Director for the State Association of Chiefs of Police, announced the achievement and presented a Certificate of Re-accreditation to Chief Dennis Miller at the Town Council meeting held on January 28, 2025. The NJ State Association of Chiefs of Police administers the accreditation program and requires agencies to adhere to best practices in five fundamental areas: administrative, personnel, operations, investigative and arrestee/detainee functions. Accepting the certificate, Chief Dennis Miller promised to continue enhancing the department and thanked his officers and staff for this significant achievement.

Group Helps Raise Awareness about Mental Wellness

What happens when a group of young people notice that mental wellness in their peers is often ignored? In Secaucus, they come together and form ProjectIris, a group that not only highlights the importance of mental health and but also creates a support system for those who need it. “There are a lot of organizations that focus on food insecurity or clothing drives, but we noticed we need a local group that cares about the mental health of our friends and classmates. We were not talking about it and giving it the attention it deserves. ProjectIris does a lot of fundraisers, and we received a tremendous support from residents and the Fire Department, especially Washington Hook and Ladder on County Avenue,” said Kritika Jhamatt, President and Founder of ProjectIris.

ProjectIris hopes to reflect the symbolism of the iris flower as a symbol of hope, positivity, gratitude and affection. Since last year, the group has been organizing fundraisers to raise awareness about mental health, and challenges stigmas that often impede a person from seeking help. “The more we talk about it, the greater the awareness,” said Mriam Awad, a ProjectIris member and volunteer at the Secaucus Fire Department. Informal meetings held at the Secaucus Public Library increase awareness regarding mental health issues and gives young residents a platform to address problems they may be facing. Issues such as bullying, eating disorders, ideation of suicide, depression, ADHD, and PTSD are highlighted on ProjectIris’ social media pages. The group has also organized several fundraisers to build their education and engagement campaigns.
